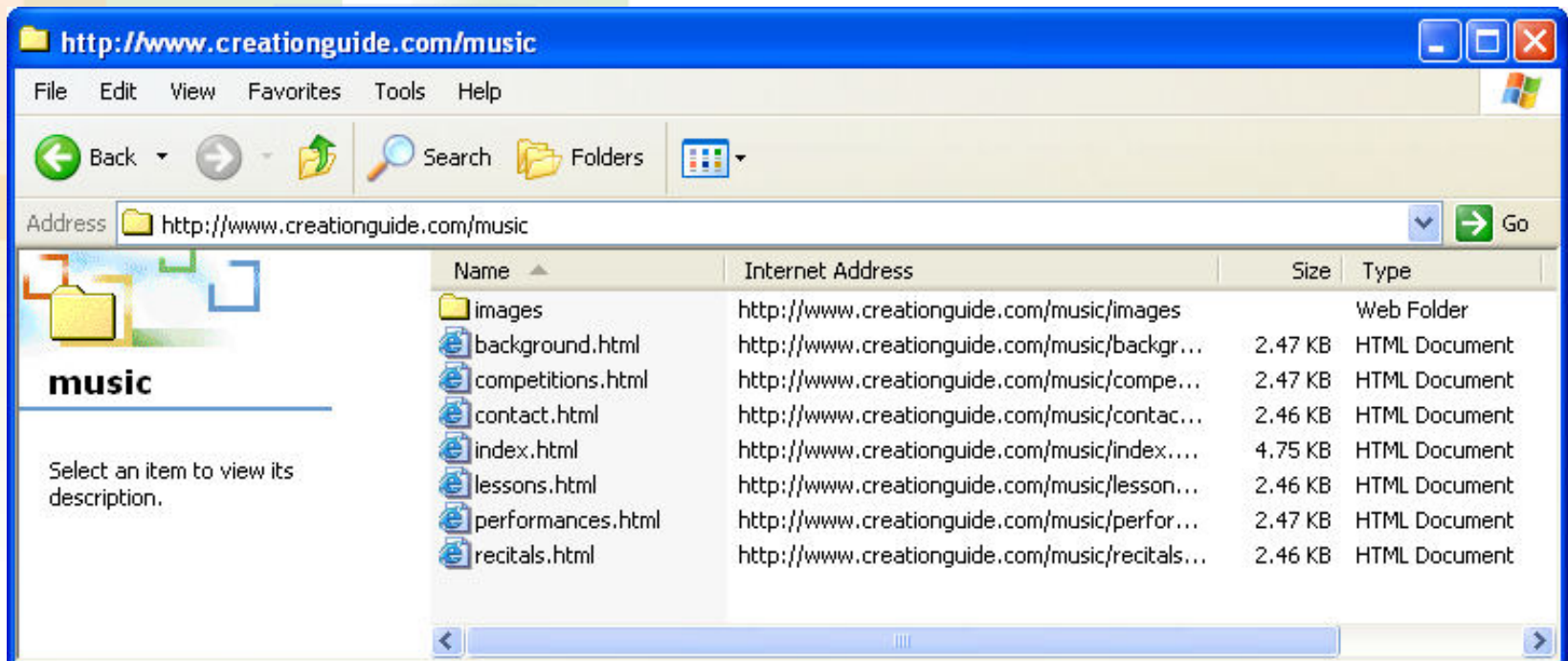

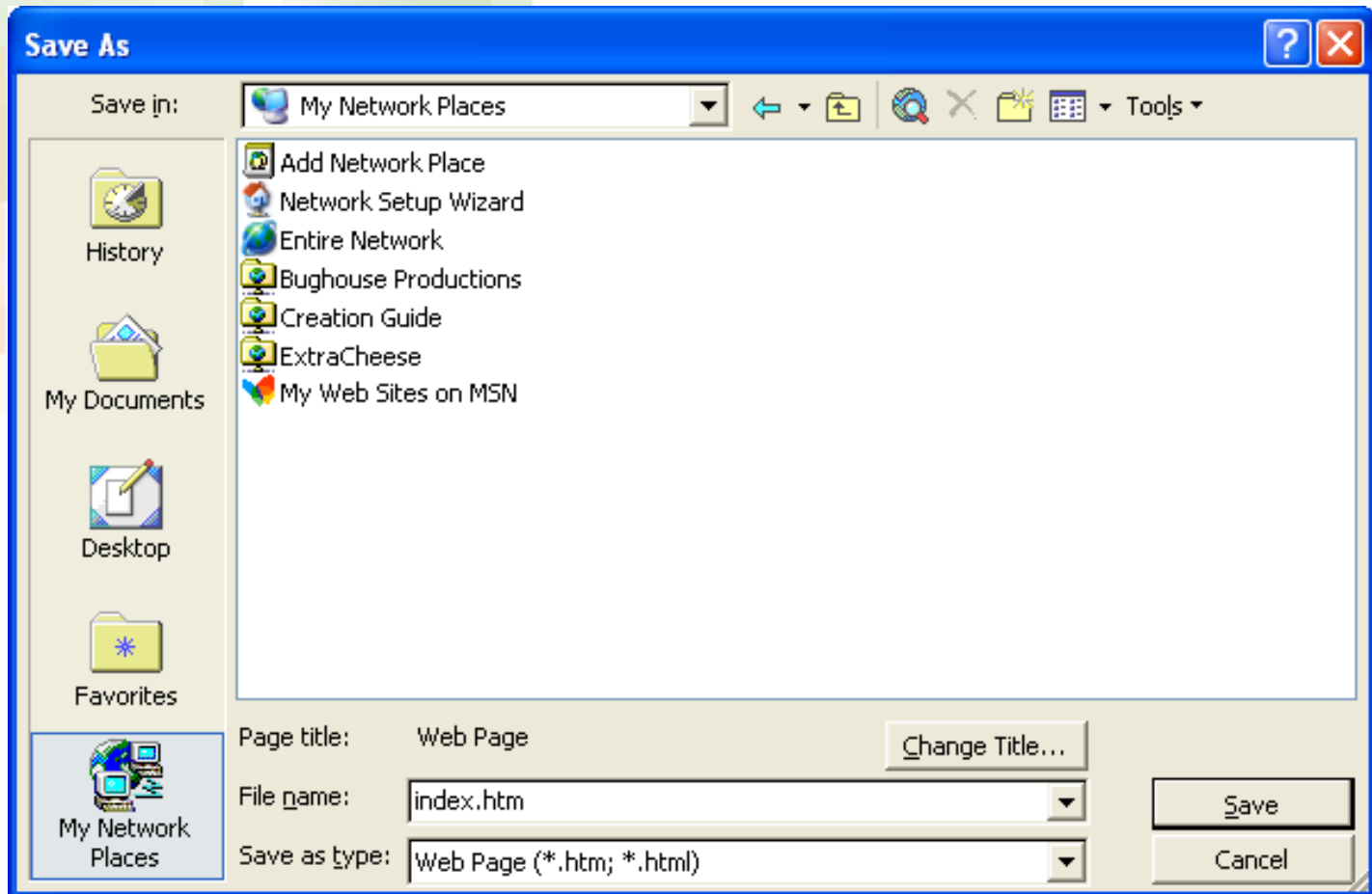

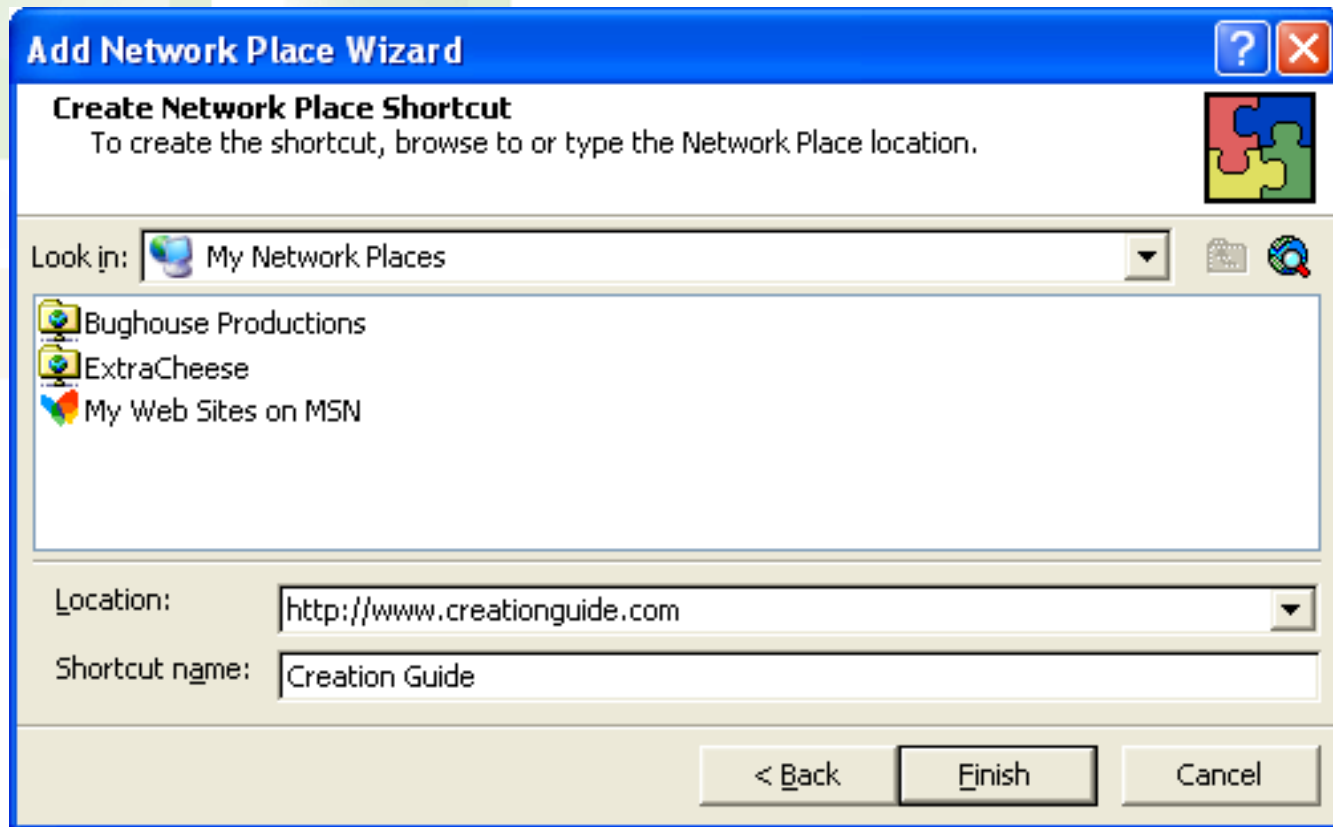

Add Network Place Wizard



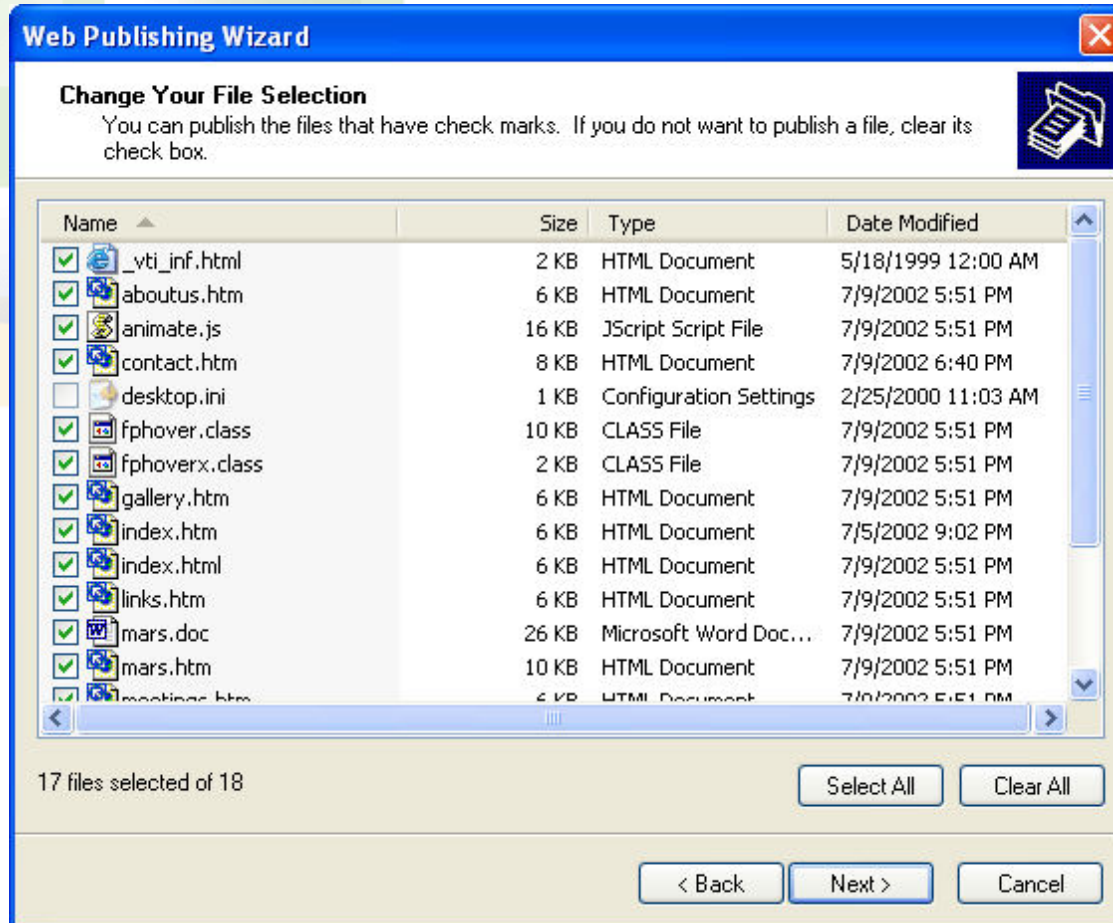
Network Place Shortcut



Reviewing

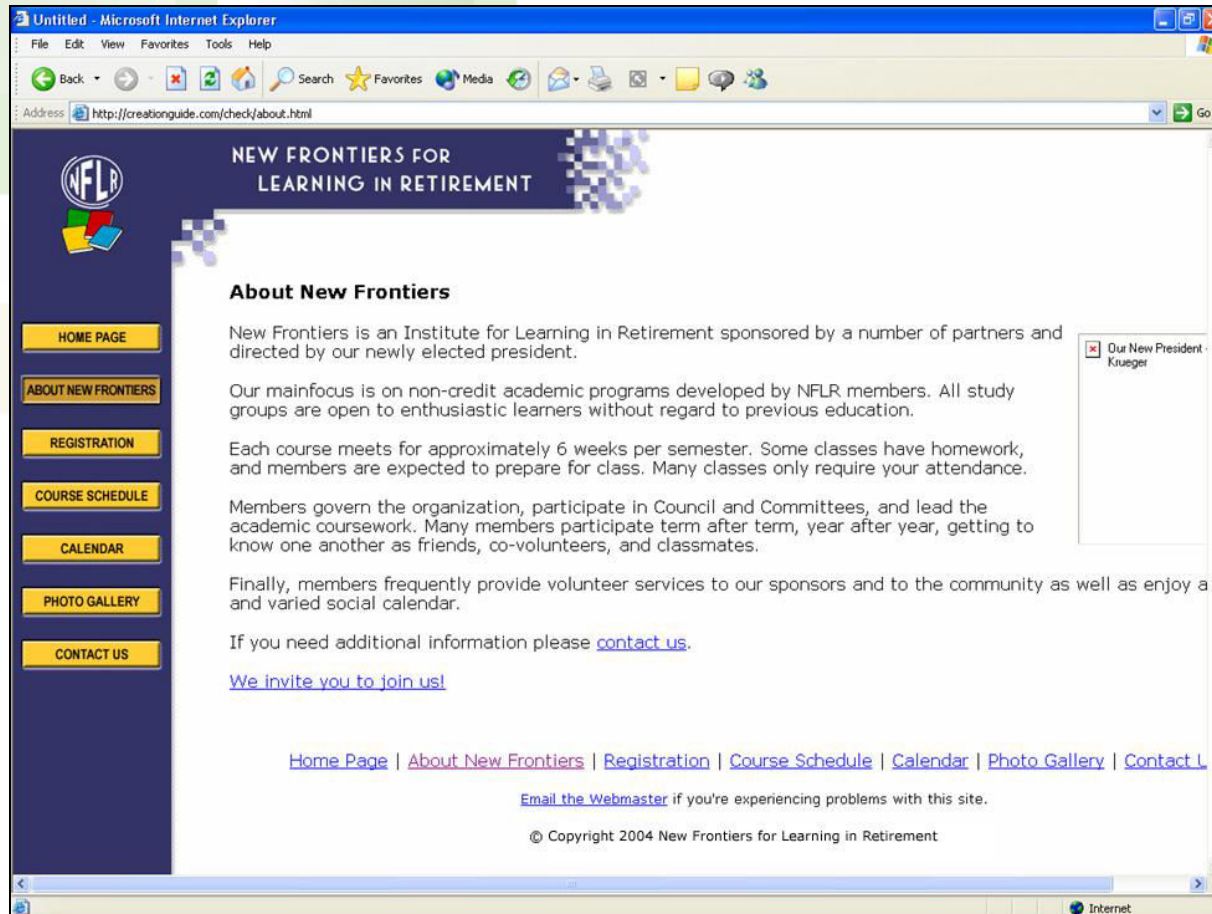
- Ensure that all images display properly.

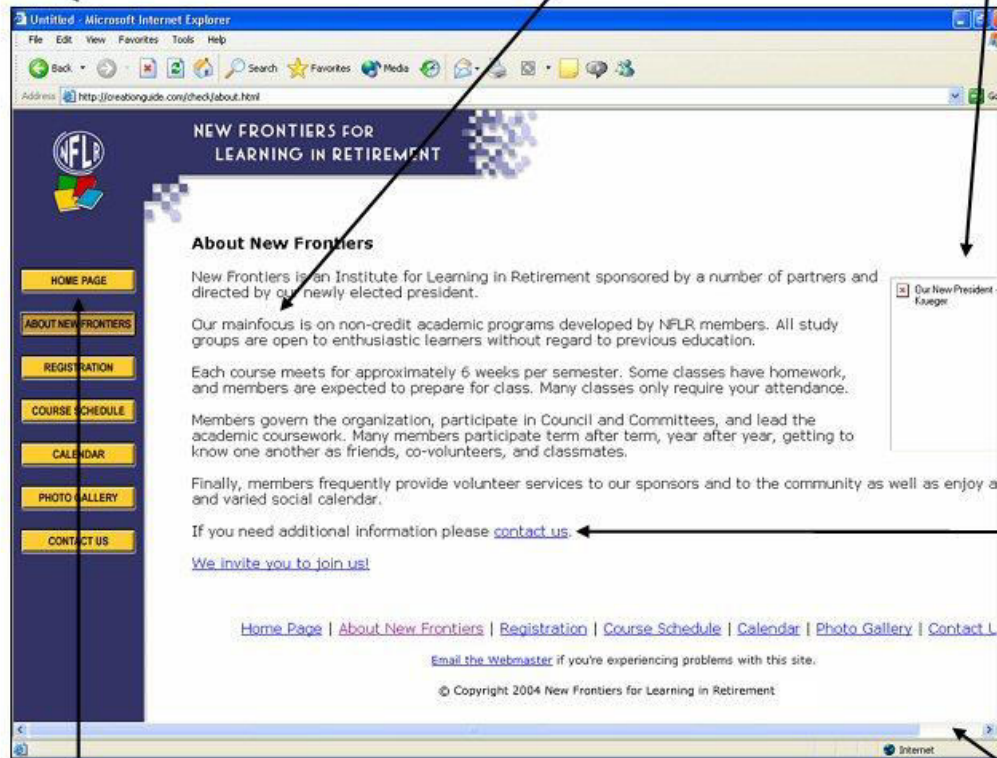
